LOSS IS A CONTINUOUS PROCESS THROUGHOUT LIFE

Understanding adult and Children's responses to loss and providing them with helpful services and resources will facilitate the development of grief and empathy skills as well as encourage bonding of students to the school community.

Critical incident stress debriefing is a structured individual or group process for students or staff who have witnessed a traumatic event. This process allows the individual to release the trauma rather than repress the experience which may lead to depression, anxiety, panic, or post traumatic stress disorder. Participants in this workshop will learn practical and meaningful skills that will enable them to provide this service to students or staff.

This workshop is recommended for: counselors, social workers, psychologists, nurses, administrators, and interested teachers. Each participant will receive a PowerPoint presentation and two staff development videos on grief.

OBJECTIVES

Participants will be able to:

- Identify normal grief process and responses to loss in adults and children
- Identify helping behaviors for working with grieving people
- Discuss remembrance activities that assist in normalizing loss and facilitating recovery
- Discuss the establishment of quiet rooms for students and staff following a loss
- Triage students during an incident
- Identify children at risk throughout the school year
- Identify the normal responses to trauma in adults and children
- Create a safe place for affected individuals to process and release the negative effects of trauma either in small groups or on an individual basis
- Facilitate art and writing activities (using journals and handouts) that may be used in assisting traumatized and grieving individuals
- Assist with small group debriefing of adults or students
- Discuss the establishing of feeder school and district networking to provide support to schools on an at-need basis
- Recognize the necessity to extend quiet room activities into support groups for continued support for at risk children

Dr. Judy Keith is a health educator, death educator, and board certified trauma specialist. She completed post-doctoral courses in marriage and family counseling. She has experience as a program administrator and independent consultant. She provides grief and trauma counseling for adults and children. She is recognized nationally as a loss and recovery expert. In addition to teaching at the university level, she has trained school districts in 42 states as an independent consultant who specializes in crisis management, grief and trauma, bullying and violence prevention, conflict resolution and communication skills. Dr. Keith is trained as a parent educator in Successful Techniques for Effective Parenting and is also approved by The Kentucky Court of Justice as a mediator in both civil and family mediation.
